COTTAGES FOR BID The Illinois District has a number of cottages that are now up for bid. To bid on a cottage you must have been a member in good standing of one of the Illinois District's five Societies for at least 90 days. Your sealed bid must include a check made out to "Illinois District American Turners" for your bid amount, the bidder's name and the cottage # being bid on. Your check will be cashed if your bid is approved. If a bid is not approved, it will be returned to you. Bids will be opened and reviewed by the District Council on July 27. Winning bidders being notified shortly thereafter. Bids may be given to any District Council or Camp Committee member. Here are the cottages up for bid

•Cottage #11 (Mosquito Hollow), #49 & #52 (Aurora Lane, behind the Rathskeller). All three of these cottages have a minimum bid of \$500 and DO NOT come with 2015 season privileges of youth program, swim tags, or coupon book.

COMINGLED RECYCLING PROGRAM

You may combine paper with the following items in the designated container for the collection of recycled products. These acceptable items consist of normal, daily discarded containers. All items should be placed loose in the designated container or if wind is an issue, in clear bags, not dark bags. Anything else should be placed in the trash container. Post-it notes, paperclips and staples do NOT have to be removed from papers before being recycled.

The following list is that which is acceptable and those items that are not acceptable:

ACCEPTABLE

GLASS CONTAINERS:

Includes bottles and jars of all colors – no window glass, ceramic, light bulbs or drinking glasses.

METAL /ALUMINUM CONTAINERS:

Aluminum, tin, steel and bi-metal food and beverage cans only. Aluminum cans foils and trays. Aerosol cans. Please rinse.

PLASTIC CONTAINERS:

All plastic containers with “PETE (#1) and HDPE (#2), 3, 4, 5, & 7 symbols underneath.

PAPER ITEMS:

White & Colored Papers

Computer Printout Paper

Copy & Fax Paper

Envelopes with & without Windows

Magazines, newspapers, junk mail

Telephone books,

Cereal and frozen food boxes

Manila File Folders, Post-it Notes

Juice box, milk and juice cartons.

Corrugated Cardboard

NOT ACCEPTABLE

Plastic Grocery Bags, dry cleaning bags

Wraps or flexible plastic, plastic sheeting

Aluminum Siding, gutters, lawn chairs, doors

Appliances, computer parts

Styrofoam cups, plates, Peanuts or #6

Clear plastic bakery or salad containers #6

Dishes and China or Ceramics
